In this role Emma oversees the vision and implementation of Outright's youth and family programming, ensuring that the structures, activities, and affinity spaces help youth and families to flourish. They also direct Camp Outright, a residential summer camp with a queer twist, where they support a team of volunteer staff, craft a fun-filled itinerary for campers, coordinate logistics, and show up for youth in the ways that they need them. When she's not pouring over program plans and cabin assignments, Emma enjoys traveling, hiking, camping, and playing with her cat, Pistachio.

As Program Manager, Holly works with PBC's partners to develop their Social Emotional Learning (SEL)and 21st-Century Learning Goals and aligns these with the programming and scheduling facilitated by the staff team. In her role as the Summer Bridge Coordinator, Holly has the joy of working with a team of facilitators and partners to bring STEM, Literacy, outdoor experiences, SEL skills, and adventure to middle-high school aged students from Trenton and Newark free of charge. Holly can often be heard belting (though often not on key) camp chants or Broadway tunes, speaking Ukrainian and supporting her friends and family there wholeheartedly, and adding plants to her already obsessive collection.

As the Executive Director of Camp Jamison, Jacqueline oversees all aspects of the organization's operations and serves as the Camp Director during camp sessions.
